



### STEP 1: REGISTER

REGISTER FOR THE SCHOOL OF CITIZENSHIP

- Join SOC by registering on our platform before December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025
- The first 150 schools to register will be selected based on a public-private and regional representativity
- Team will liaise with the selected schools in December for the training schedule
- Most committed and passionate teachers are welcome to join the training

## STEP 2: TRAINING OBJECTIVES

A TOOL DEVELOPED WITH THE CENTER FOR EDUCATIONAL RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT (CRDP)

- Train the principals and the teachers to transform their school into an institution that builds strong and active citizens
- Develop policies that reinforce initiative, commitment to the common good, justice, and accountability
- Activate student councils as democratic tools and integrate community projects into annual school plans
- Train teachers to apply civic competencies so they can transmit positive citizenship values to learners
- Develop leadership, participation, teamwork, problem-solving, resource and time management skills, and the capacity for continuous evaluation and improvement

A NETWORK OF LOCAL PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS ACCOMPANIES SCHOOLS


- Access to advanced workshops and follow-up sessions tailored to your school's needs with our local partners network




